## 4.1. Description of first aid measures

#### General information

#### Inhalation

Remove affected person from source of contamination. Move affected person to fresh air and keep warm and at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Maintain an open airway. ## Appropriate engineering controls

Provide adequate ventilation.
